

A Modern Talking Stick

Many of us recall the talking sticks at last summer's "Is Your Life in Balance" gathering at Stony Point. During the Talking Stick workshop we learned of its honorable and important value in the culture of our Native American brothers and sisters. Then later, at our closing campfire, a talking stick was passed from one person to another. That generated spur of the moment comments from each of us, in turn. We recall the relaxed fellowship and the fun we had around that campfire, as we passed the talking stick, sharing those comments that were both sparkling jewels and even clunky rocks.

Sometimes our routine PW communications are like that as well. Within our PWs we have sparkling jewels of communication, where PW sisters share important and meaningful information. By virtue of these communications we encourage and sustain one another through activities, projects and personal nurturing.

At other times we sometimes experience stonelike communications, the kind that just go 'clunk'. When that occurs, we failed to share the knowledge and creativity beyond our local bounds, and the wealth of those ideas and their potential for usefulness by others falls to the ground and is lost. When I travel to PW gatherings and in conversations moderators, I often learn of exciting projects and accomplishments that have not been shared with others and are thus lost because of the lack of good communication.

Today, here, now in the year 2006 we have at our disposal a different sort of talking stick with which we use in speaking and to listening. We call it the World Wide Web. Whether we like it or not, we are now a computer oriented world where:

- The dissemination of information from PW Churchwide in Louisville is sent primarily by computer including information critical to social, economic and environment mission related issues.
- Individuals and churches receive Presbytery newsletters and general information by e-mail.
- Time sensitive exchanges between individual PW leaders allow for solutions to occur in just minutes, rather than days, at virtually no cost.

In order to share important ongoing information, it is imperative that PWs across the Synod speak and listen using the computer/web as a talking stick. (*continued on page 2*)

I urge each PWC and PWP to meet the challenge of transferring current communication by putting into place the following by January 2007:

- Assign e-mail contacts for each PW and church in your Presbytery (whether there is an active PW group or not), to disseminate incoming communications and information.
- Forward the Lighthouse, e-mail version, to all of your PW contacts.
- Submit a PW entry for each issue of your Presbytery newsletter.
- Utilize your Synod PW web site www.pwsne.org. Postings can be made on the web site by contacting our webservant Abbie Slaman at slamans@optonline.net.

Communication is effective when all PW Sisters can speak, be heard and be appreciated throughout the Synod of Northeast and beyond. We can accomplish this with a modern Talking Stick called the computer.

First, my thanks to all of you who sent your Presbytery directories, newsletters and lists of your PWP coordinators and Enablers to me in response to my request. I have forwarded some

70+/- names (including contacts and cluster communicators) to churchwide for their mailing lists. The PW Enabler (PWE) newsletter should be going out in the spring. If you don't receive a copy, please contact me. Also, if you still don't have a copy of the training packet, I have copies and will be happy to send you one. There's a lot of really good information in them.

Of importance to you, if you have been selected as a voting delegate to the Churchwide

Gathering (CWG), is the following: voting delegates MUST register by mail. You will be staying at the Galt House. The Business Meeting will be held on Friday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. and on Saturday from 1:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. This means that you will likely have to arrive in Louisville on the 6th rather than the 7th. You can only sign up for afternoon opportunities, workshops, or video previews for Sunday and Monday.

Other items that should be conveyed to your church groups are the posters for "Women Who Make a Difference" and the "Shoes and Socks" collection plus the various children's programs that are available. Information on the "Shoes and Socks" collection is in the registration booklet but the "Women Who Make a Difference" info is in Horizons. Also, it is mandatory that a Synod luncheon advance reservation be made as there will not be any walk-ins allowed this year. The reservation form is in this issue of *The Lighthouse*. If you are an Enabler and have not received a registration booklet, please contact either me or your Presbytery Moderator. ΑII Presbytery Moderators were sent 100 copies of the registration booklet for distribution. If your CT has extras, many moderators have been taking them to their Presbytery meetings for distribution. This is also a good opportunity, if it is allowed, to have a "suitcase" display for the CWG gathering showcasing, if available, past souvenirs, i.e. mugs, pins, T-shirts, tote bags, daily newspaper from Horizons, Horizons pictures of the gatherings, etc. You can find the PW Churchwide Gathering Web Pages at www.pcusa.org/pwgathering.

Finally, there will be three PWE trainings before the CWG, all of which have taken advantage of the grants available. And, I would like to thank both Lois DeWitt and Ginnie Miller for all their help in assisting me in compiling the list of Enablers to send to CW.

Walkyria Rosa de Brito Chosen as Global Partner

It is our pleasure to announce that Walkyria Rosa de Brito from Newark Presbytery was chosen by the Churchwide Global Partners Committee to attend the Churchwide Gathering at no charge. Walkyria is from Brazil. She was referred to the Global Partners Committee by PW in the Synod of the Northeast and we will be responsible for her transportation to Louisville.

She stood next to the chairs of the other two women. When introductions were made, nobody mentioned her name. She was dark-skinned, with prominent cheekbones, and a dark knit cap on her head. She might have been sixty years old, or perhaps younger or older. After a little while, our knight-in-shining-armor, John Davison, brought a chair over to her, for her to sit down. Later, I inquired what her name was. Her name was Elena.

The little story above took place in Sao Paulo. We Global Exchange participants had gone to visit a tenement dwelling that had been built by the occupants. We were seated in a large common area, facing two women who were seated, and the one woman standing. In our debriefings, we were warned to remember that we are not experts. But how could I not notice that the dark-skinned woman was standing, while the other two women sat? How could I not notice that she wasn't introduced, when the other two were introduced? At least she was there. It may have been wrong for me to think the different treatment was because of her color, but I couldn't think of another reason. (John Davison was the one man on the Global Exchange. Ever the gallant gentleman, John represented Worldwide Ministries Division and was accompanied by his wife Mary Lou.)

The story of racism in Brazil is different from America's story. In the US, miscegenation was illegal in many states until the 1960s, and still is a taboo in many parts of the country (and in the minds and hearts of many people). In Brazil,

mixing the races was encouraged, with the hope that this would result in everyone being equal. It didn't turn out quite that way. The people who are most likely to be poor and disadvantaged are darker. Brazil has the highest population of black people of any country in the world except for Nigeria.

As we drove around Rio de Janeiro on our Jeep tour, we could see that the people of the favelas (the shanty towns) were mostly black. Our tour guide, Damiana, shared with us information that she probably does not share with her average tour group. She told us that her birth certificate indicated that she was "light," since when she was a baby, her skin was light. She now claims her heritage as a black woman. (Birth certificates indicate skin color, but not race.) She also said that when she was in high school, living in a favela, she did her homework by candlelight, because her family didn't have electricity.

Both Brazil and the United States (as well as most other countries) have more work to do to


eradicate racism. It's a daunting task, since the battle takes place mostly in human hearts. But it's a task we must undertake, because God, parent of us all, loves us all equally, and



wants each of us to use all of our God-given gifts without restriction.

Peace in Israel and Palestine



The question "How do we achieve peace in Israel and Palestine?" is extremely complex and deserves our prayers that a just compromise may one day be reached.

In the last year major developments have occurred. This past summer the Gaza Strip was returned to the Palestinians. Prime Minister Ariel Sharon has had a major stroke. The Hebron Settlement located in the West Bank has been declared a closed military zone. This means that only residents may enter. This is a rare step taken by the army against Israeli Jews. Usually such declarations are put into force when the military is facing what it considers to be a serious unrest in Palestinian areas.

In August the Mission Responsibility Through Investment (MRTI) Committee of the Presbyterian Church (USA) announced that they are beginning a process of "progressive engagement" with five companies that they say are contributing to the ongoing violence between Israel and Palestine. The companies are Caterpillar, Citigroup, ITT Industries, Motorola and United Technologies. More about this action may be found in the January/February 06 edition of Horizons, page 34.

A year ago I represented the PW of our Synod at the conference on "Steps toward Peace in Israel and Palestine" in Louisville. We left the conference brimming with information, both in our minds and on paper, to share with others. After returning home, I had the privilege of presenting information I gleamed to the Presbyterian Women's Gatherings of the Geneva Presbytery and the Presbytery of Western NY.

Memorable Event at CCT Meeting (Little Rock, Arkansas)



The members of the Churchwide Coordinating Team (CCT) were privileged to be present at the groundbreaking for the Presbyterian Disaster Warehouse at Ferncliff Conference Center in November.

This warehouse will be paid for with a Birthday Offering Grant. The Ferncliff Camp and Conference Center was also the site for the CCT meetings.

Communication

Staff Update

All vacant PW positions in Louisville have been filled. Cheri Harper (charper@ctr.pcusa.org) is now serving as the program associate for synod support, and is also staffing the Mission Relationships Committee on the Churchwide Coordinating Team (CCT). Carissa Herold (cherold@ctr.pcusa.org) is serving as the marketing associate, and will be helping all CCT committees with getting the PW message out. In addition, Women's Ministries has added two associates and two interns.

Mission Relationships Committee (MRC)

I served as a member of the MRC at the November CCT. Now I will be the new committee chair.

PW Mission Matters

All of PW Mission will be interpreted under one name, PW Mission Matters. The name of the program replacing Mission Opportunities is Together in Service. A new guide will be produced with interpretation, forms, and other materials for PW mission, PC(USA) mission and ecumenical mission. This guide will be available at the 2006 Churchwide Gathering. A workshop and other introductory materials will also be featured at the Gathering.

US Study Trip

The MRC will explore adding to the 2006-2009 triennium a short-term (5-7 days) US study trip with a single focus. The length and cost of the Global Exchange excludes younger women, working women and students. A shorter US trip will provide the opportunity to connect the issues raised by Global Exchanges with similar issues within the US, and ties globalization issues together. Possible destinations might be to Alaska (native peoples), US/Mexico border (border issues), or South Dakota (rural issues).

ONE Campaign

The MRC encourages all Presbyterian women to sign on to the ONE Campaign urging the US to commit an additional one percent of the federal budget to development and humanitarian assistance by 2010. Hopefully, this additional expenditure could have an impact on eliminating poverty and AIDS in developing countries. For information. go to the web site www.ONE.org. Conference Participation

The CCT has called upon the Synod of the Northeast to send PW members for the 2006 PC(USA) delegation to the UN Commission on the Status of Women. They are Magdalene Lewis, Dee Evelyn Matthews, and Judy Wason. Also attending will be Vice-Moderator Lillian Oats, who resides in New York City part of the year. Monica Lin (Member at Large on the CCT, and member of the Mission Relationships Committee) will be going to the Democratic Republic of the Congo with International Health Ministries in May, to observe our mission dollars at work.

One Meal Fast

The CCT invites everyone to participate in a One Meal Fast on Ash Wednesday, March 1, 2006. Money saved by fasting may be given to Cents-Ability, an important part of the Presbyterian Hunger Program. Cents-Ability is a small first step in the battle against hunger and poverty. Congregations invite every member---of all ages---to contribute a few cents at every meal. Racial Ethnic Dialogue Grants

Unzu Lee explained that a group for racial ethnic dialogue does not have to be a synod-wide or presbytery-wide group. It could actually be a very small group. Also, the first meeting did not have to happen before the end of 2005, as previously stated. Unzu will be sending a communication to synod moderators and representatives to clarify the intent of the Dialogue and the guidelines.
