Editor's Note: We are grateful for JoAnn to take the time to submit the following to us. We are so pleased with our PWSNE representation of the Churchwide level.

Happy 2019 women in the Synod of the Northeast! We are a bit into the year, but I like to wish everyone a happy and healthy days all year long.

I am happy to hear that the women in the Synod of the NE are starting a new class of Sisters Stand and Walk Together (SSWT) program that trains women to be leaders in the future. This is a wonderful program that has proven success. I urge each of you to help Moderator Gray and the Team with this new class. You will enjoy having a hand in building future leaders.

This year, PW has two new Together In Service (TIS) mission opportunities that everyone (women, men, & children) can take part in. These two opportunities were developed from the overwhelming needs of the people in the Synod of Puerto Rico resulting from the Hurricane that devasted most of the island and adjoining islands. The efforts from the Federal Government have not been enough to bring back the necessary services for healthy living, and re-building. The first new TIS is the opportunity to individually (or as a group) support with a financial contribution(s) for a long-term water supply system, and home reconstruction. The second new TIS is a hands-on project (PW Pillowcases) for children in Puerto Rico. These pillowcases will demonstrate love, concern, and will provide prayers for children who have suffered the devasting results of loss from Hurricane Maria. It might be fun for a family to decorate some pillowcases together to be sent to children in need! We are hoping for at least a 100 by August 2019.

I thank all of you for your support of the Thank and Birthday Offerings. I encourage you to continue supporting these two giving opportunities. We do have another giving opportunity (the Mission Pledge Annual Fund) that we all should support continuously. Quarterly support would really help our organization with the many items that this fund addresses. Our Mission Pledge Annual Fund is used for programing, publishing, and staff support to our PW Groups in the congregations, presbyteries, and in the Synods. It provides participation in events that develop and enhance PW leaders. It helps with continued mission partnerships with PCUSA, with past Global & USAME partners, and it helps develop new partnerships brought about through our mission trips. The Mission Pledge plays a part in hands-on projects, directing prayer, supporting solidarity in ecumenical movements, and advocacy efforts for peace & justice. This fund supports the regular meetings of your PW Board of Directors, and it provides funds for operating expenses (rent, utilities, insurance, office supplies, and staff salaries). It is the fund that enables us to carry on the mission work of the Presbyterian Women Organization.

A suggestion might be for all of us (at our churches) to have an annual celebration of the PW Mission Pledge Annual Fund. A Dedication Service could be designed just like we do for the Birthday and Thank Offering. Writing and designing a celebration service would give the women of your church an opportunity to show off some of your talents. This once a year dedication fund raising service at our churches would encourage us to do more, help us grow in faith and numbers, help make connections with church members, and help Presbyterian Women with economic stability.

There are other opportunities for mission work. One opportunity is to encourage Presbyteries to give their PWP Moderators voice and vote. If you have voice and vote in your Presbytery help your sisters in other Presbyteries that do not have voice and vote. Encourage them to speak up and request voice & vote. Advise them on how you got voice and vote. Another mission opportunity is to work with our sisters who do not have organized Presbyterian Women circles/groups in their congregations. Invite them to your meetings, your teas, your gatherings, your book groups, your get-togethers. Include them in every activity your group does. Treat them just like they are a member of your group. Show them how the Presbyterian Women organization can benefit them in their activities. Show them that sharing stories can be faith strengthening, and shared stories will open new doors for them.

PWSNE I applaud all that you do, and I pray for continued success in your endeavors in mission, peace, and justice for all.

Have a wonderful 2019! Let Moderator Lisa Gray and your PW Synod Rep Jo-Ann Estella know what you are doing.

PW Pillowcases

Presbyterian Women can demonstrate love, concern and prayers for the children affected by Hurricane Maria in Puerto Rico. PW, Inc. is partnering with the three presbyteries on the island of Puerto Rico to create personalized pillowcases and distribute them through Presbyterian churches and schools. PW will send personalized pillowcases to the PW of the Synod of Puerto Rico in August 2019. We are hoping for at least 100! How can you help? Create a special pillowcase for a child!

Purchase a "blank" pillowcase and . . . get creative!

- Create a pattern with fabric paint or dip-dyes and stencils or stamps. Glue on buttons, felt or ribbons.
- Embroider designs or use iron-on appliqués. Stitch on lace borders or a crocheted edging.

Or make your own pillowcases!

- · Sew, quilt, crochet or knit a whole pillowcase with fun colors.
- Choose child-friendly designs; skilled sewers can make them reversible!

Be sure to include a message.

- . Write a note telling a child in Puerto Rico that you are sending love and care with the pillowcase.
- Send a prayer or special bible verse; send a picture of yourself, your church or your PW group.
- Sew in a label that identifies the group or shares a word of hope (perhaps in Spanish).

Make it an intergenerational project.

- . Invite a young person to decorate a pillowcase with you; use the time to teach a new hands-on skill.
- Talk about the importance of mission while you're working.

Or, you may choose to donate craft supplies

Editors Note: As Sandy mentions in this article she is moving to be closer to her son. We bid her not only a fond farewell but best wishes for her future in her new home. Maybe if we head that way we can pay her a visit.

This will be my last article as PWS Historian. I have enjoyed doing it and being a part of the Presbyterian Women in the Synod of the Northeast in several capacities, but all good things must come to an end. Many of you know I am moving, for those that do not, I am heading to VA to be nearer my family – something I did not think I would do! The closing on my condo will be February 15 so this whole thing is moving more quickly than I expected it to, but it is what it is!

I've asked several past moderators for their thoughts on PW and perhaps what got them involved way back at the beginning. This time I asked Maxine Hunter for her thoughts. Here is what she had to say:

As I stood washing the breakfast dishes, I found myself singing, "Precious memories, how they linger...". The song was triggered because I was in the process of writing this article for Sandy Grillo. She had tasked me with the challenge of sharing some of my thoughts, feelings, memories, etc., for the Lighthouse History section. Here are few thoughts and remembrances for you. Enjoy!

My journey at the PWP level began with the promise of a homemade chicken sandwich complete with mayo and lettuce. It was time for the 1986 Spring PWP Gathering in the Presbytery of Cayuga-Syracuse. The only requirement for us to attend was to bring our own lunch. As a newbie in the Morrisville Community Church I was enticed to attend by one of our group's best cooks/lunch makers. She said, "If you come, I'll make you a chicken sandwich with lettuce and mayo." What a deal I thought, and I accepted the offer without hesitation. Over the next 15 years I became increasingly involved in PWP, leading to my becoming their PWP Moderator in 2001. Just think about this: It all begin with a chicken sandwich.

Another small, but to me, interesting moment in my journey occurred at the registration table of my first ever attendance at a PW in the Synod of the Northeast Gathering. It was the 1999 Fall Gathering/Business Meeting of PWSNE. Although I had no official position with our PWP or the Synod at that time, I was able to attend. On arrival, and since I wasn't an officer or voting representative, I was left alone. I walked up to the registration table to give my name and get whatever info. I would need. What luck. Jane Mosher was the registrar that day, and Sandy Grillo was standing smiling beside her. I didn't know who they were but registering went smoothly. I thought to myself, "Wow, these gals seem friendly." As I lingered over signing my name, Sandy Grillo, who I just met for the first time in my life, said, "My, but you have beautiful blue eyes!" I was totally surprised, and said, "I don't think my hus-

band has ever noticed." We both laughed. As I ambled away in search of my room, I thought to myself, "Now that was really unexpected---and I wasn't even fishing for a compliment. I think this is going to be okay." Actually, the whole event—the workshops, the plenary meetings, and particularly the singing-- was better than okay. I sometimes smile to myself about all of this because that day which started with a compliment morphed fifteen years later into my accepting—which surprised me and perhaps my friends—the position of Moderator of PWSNE.

Lastly, the best part for me about being involved in Presbyterian Women was and still is all the friends I have made. Here's a sample of my friendship roll call (get the beat): There is Gail, Anne, Magdalene, and Jane M.; there is Jo Ann, Joanne, Joan, and Joann; there is Sandy, Charlotte, Sophie and Schuchen; there is Beth, Jane K., Jyungin and Moon; there is Sharon, Rosalie, Su-Ling and Lisa; there is Gloria, Susan, Ardelle and Rita; there is Ginnie, Virginia, Lorie and Hsiu-Fen; and forever within my heart and perhaps yours, too, is Viola, Jane M., Joan C., Emily; Dotsie, and Carlyon.

Yes, memories are precious and as the old gospel song says, "how they linger deep within my soul."

I think Maxine expresses the heart and soul of PWSNE. What do you think?

Recently I was invited by a long time church friend (my former congregation in Long Valley) to join about a dozen people for lunch and she invited (my first) the pastor from the "late seventies". What a warm reunion! One woman who use to run an antiques shop in the Poconos reminded me of the time I planned a "day trip" (I was moderator of the church's Presbyterian Women at that time) to her shop, a few other shops, the candle factory and of course lunch. She even remembered the pink Depression Glass plate I purchased. She asked if I still had it. I do. AND she remembered I collect it.

It got me to thinking this morning about my planning to write something for the winter newsletter for my local church, Presbytery PW as Peace and Justice Coordinator (yes still) and Synod level as moderator. I'm trying to wrap up and promote all the things Presbyterian Women can do to follow their purpose: prayer and bible study, support mission, work for justice and peace, and there comes: "...build an inclusive caring community of women that strengthens our denomination and witness to the promises of God's kingdom".

When we build those ties we create women who will join us in ministry and mission of Presbyterian Women. So I invite all women to think about ways we can be bound together in Christian love, if even on a "road trip". Look to a talent, job, hobby, (another trip was the Gospel Cruise around NYC from Weehawken NJ), entertainment that is local or even a food bank to spend a "mission day".

So dear sisters I suggest we not forget the building block, which although it appears **last** in the purpose is the thing we should begin with **first**. Tell PW in your church what you'd like to do or better yet volunteer yourself to organize it!

Birthday Offering

The Birthday Offering is one of Presbyterian Women's two offerings. Received in the spring each year, it gives women a tangible way to celebrate the blessings in their lives. The Birthday Offering funds up to five projects each year, in amounts of \$75,000 to \$150,000 each. The recipients are selected before the offering is received, so grant amounts depend on the gifts received.

Disaster Response Team

Presbytery of Charlotte, Charlotte, North Carolina The Disaster Response Team of the Presbytery of Charlotte will expand its ministry to support people affected by human-made or natural disasters. PW's grant will help provide a warehouse, parking lot and security fencing. This new space will hold household goods, food, hygiene, and school kits, and clean-up buckets, and will house mobile shower units and disaster recovery trailers.

Effingham Child Development Center Inclusive Playground, Effingham, Illinois In a child's early years inclusive play environments set the tone for successful future relationships. The Effingham Child Development Center serves children and families of differing abilities and is paving the way for all kids to learn and play together. The Birthday Offering will improve the center's playground by helping to provide a protective play surface and all-inclusive play equipment.

Presbyterian Homes and Services of Kentucky, Inc.

Good Shepherd Community Nursing Center, Phelps, Kentucky

Presbyterian Homes and Services of Kentucky cares for people who are sick, poor, lonely or vulnerable due to infirmities of age and poor health. This project will improve the quality of life and safety for nursing center residents in the Appalachian region of Eastern Kentucky. PW's grant will help provide new wardrobes, bedside cabinets, overbed tables, nursing beds, mattresses and lift recliners.

Wings of Refuge

Restoration Home, Iowa Falls, Iowa
Wings of Refuge provides a safe and healing
space for women victimized by human trafficking.
Without safety and shelter, there is little healing.
PW's Birthday Offering grant will help fund a larger
long-term safe home where many more women will
find restoration, identity, community, opportunity
and hope, and transition into independent living.

SISTERS STAND AND WALK TOGETHER

SISTERS STAND and WALK TOGETHER (SSWT) is beginning enrollment for a **new class**. It can be up to a three-year program of Presbyterian Women in the Synod of the Northeast. It was originally designed to acclimate and motivate new immigrant women from congregations within the Synod to Presbyterian Women. They met three times a year. We hope to attract ALL women who are new to Presbyterian Women who want to start or enhance an existing PW group by learning skills to prepare for leadership roles. There is no financial cost to the participant.

The goals of the program are to build community and confidence, help women feel comfortable with public speaking and commit to the purpose of Presbyterian Women. SISTERS STAND and WALK TOGETHER seeks to prepare the women through leadership development training including forums and workshops where cultural and gender differences are explored and leadership shared. Several graduates have taken leadership roles in Presbyterian Women in the Synod of the Northeast and Churchwide.

The group will meet at Valley Stream Presbyterian Church (Long Island, walking distance from the Long Island Railroad train stop). Participants are encouraged to attend PW events in Albany, at Stony Point and Louisville. The training sessions could include (as needed):

Exposure to the Presbyterian Women's manual (purpose, principles, structure, and are circles are they still relevant), *Horizons* magazine and the PW Quarterly Leadership Newsletter.

Conversations about cultural and gender barrier issues and women's role in the church. Finding your WHY in Presbyterian Women.

How to develop and lead a Bible study (including how to build community by conducting an 'ice breaker').

How to plan and lead a worship service, creating one for the training sessions.

How to plan an agenda and lead a meeting (by consensus), run a workshop.

Communication skills including listening/conflict resolution and technology for flyers, newsletters, conference calls. Best practices for (personal invitations) attracting attendance at Gatherings, fundraising events and securing participation on a Design Team.

Bringing it all together, taking it to the world.

Homework may be given to participate and/or lead in a worship service, small group session or Sunday School class in our home church.

The next class begins **Sat.**, **April 6**, **2019**, **from 9:30- 3:00 pm**. More classes will be scheduled at everyone's mutual need and availability. For further information, contact:
