


These are some questions that can be answered by a representative of Moms Demand Action for Gun Sense in America at our Fall Gathering.



Arizona and the Border Region

I am with you and will keep you wherever you go. Gen. 28:15



The Presbyterian Women USA Mission Experience will take place October 13–23, 2023.

During this faith-deepening and relationship-building trip, the group will visit partners in Phoenix, Tucson, and the Arizona-Mexico border, focusing on immigration and refugee issues, violence against women and children throughout the immigration process, and challenges facing indigenous people living in Arizona. Participants will experience learning, accompanying, and serving, with significant time set aside for reflection, conversation, and prayer as we encounter deep hurt as well as hope. The trip will include stays at the Franciscan Renewal Center near Phoenix, the Redemptorist Renewal Center in Tucson, and a local hotel in Agua Prieta, Mexico. The group will worship with local congregations, join a weekly vigil at the Arizona–Mexico border, and visit with mission partners such as Frontera de Cristo (a Presbyterian border ministry and 2021 Thank Offering recipient), and Café Justo (a fair-trade coffee cooperative). The purpose of the PW USA Mission Experience is to equip participants with an understanding of the history and culture of a particular region as well as the challenges, hopes and ministries of mission partners who serve God's people there. Traditionally, one Presbyterian woman from each synod joins the delegation and spends the following two years sharing the experience with groups within her synod. Return your completed USAME application to your PW in the Synod moderator by November 1, 2022, and send a copy to your PW in the Presbytery moderator.

The cost of the trip will be \$2,400. Scholarships are available at the Synod level, and, if the woman selected is from Highlands Presbytery, PWP will cover \$500 of the trip.

DAYS

The first 1,000 days refers to a child's life from the moment they are conceived until they have reached 2 years of age (24 months). This is a time when their brain, body and immune system grows and develops significantly. It is a crucial window of opportunity to create brighter, healthier futures. The first 1,000 days are a time of tremendous potential and enormous vulnerability. How well or how poorly mothers and children are nourished and cared for during this time has a profound impact on a child's ability to grow, learn and thrive. This is because the first 1,000 days are when a child's brain begins to grow and develop and when the foundations for their lifelong health are built.

To support mothers and babies, PW here in Highlands is issuing a challenge to each church – between now and the Spring Gathering collect 1,000 coins – any value – and bring them to the Gathering. Your hard-working treasurer will get them counted, by church, and publish the results.
