MODERATOR'S MUSINGS

Grace and peace I bring to you in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

As my husband and I were cleaning up the Christmas decorations in Fairmount Presbyterian Church's Sanctuary, we removed the sconces and the tall wooden frames attached to the ends of the pews. This entailed unscrewing the wooden fixtures, cleaning the glass globes, digging out any dried wax in the fixtures from the candle wax that dripped into the crevices while burning, packing everything up and carrying all of it into the 'attic'. (This is really where the bats hang out, otherwise known as the 'belfry', and yes, Fairmount has had its share of bats!)

While Skeet was drilling the screws for the wooden holders to put them into place in the closet, I was digging through a large plastic container filled with wreaths for every season, to place new wreaths in the front of the Sanctuary. All of a sudden, my hand was pricked by a thorn on a wreath made of grapevine.

And I reflected, how must this have felt on Christ's forehead!

As we exited the season of Advent, of expectations, of gifts, the gift of our savior, we now enter into a new season, one of the Baptism of the Lord, of Epiphany, of His transfiguration, of the season of Lent, and His crucifixion and His resurrection. Hallelujah for the resurrection, for where would we be without His suffering and resurrection.

He came to release us from suffering. He suffered for our sins. How much pain did he endure, not just with that crown of thorns on his head, but the beatings and hanging on that cross.

Who am I to complain of a little prick on my hand from a grapevine wreath when He, and so many others suffer atrocities in this world.

Let us pray, as it is said in the Beatitudes, in the Gospel of Matthew 5:3-12

- ⁴ "Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted.
- ⁵ "Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth.

- ⁶ "Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled.
- ⁷ "Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy.
- ⁸ "Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God.
- ⁹ "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God.
- ¹⁰ "Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.
- ¹¹ "Blessed are you when people insult you, persecute you and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of me.
- ¹² Rejoice and be glad, because great is your reward in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you." (NIV)

leaders (small church groups) need to plant new to replace an old thing that withered away, didn't survive the flood? How can we adjust our habits of taking care of PW to thrive? Or plant a new one as I did?

Over Christmas the tree was by this window & my husband broke off the shoot on the orchid that was going to bloom around Christmas - see that stem upper right? I had been so happy it was going to bloom for the holidays. I had a word or two with him about ruining the potential blooms. I just let it be. Persistence won out! I continued the correct watering schedule & rotated it to the light when needed. There are over 5-6 flowers that will bloom shortly on the redirected stem. More than the original! Nature repaired his clumsiness and rewarded me with extra flowers.

So what isn't "working" in PW that just needs a little redirection? How do we as leadership persistently wait for new growth? What care techniques can we continue, what new ones might we begin?

DAYS

The first 1,000 days refers to a child's life from the moment they are conceived until they have reached 2 years of age (24 months). This is a time when their brain, body and immune system grows and develops significantly. It is a crucial window of opportunity to create brighter, healthier futures. The first 1,000 days are a time of tremendous potential and enormous vulnerability. How well or how poorly mothers and children are nourished and cared for during this time has a profound impact on a child's ability to grow, learn and thrive. This is because the first 1,000 days are when a child's brain begins to grow and develop and when the foundations for their lifelong health are built.

To support mothers and babies, PW here in Highlands is issuing a challenge to each church – between now and the Spring Gathering collect 1,000 coins – any value – and bring them to the Gathering. Your hard-working treasurer will get them counted, by church, and publish the results.

Good News from Bread for the World. In October, 2022, Public Law No: 117-214 (HR 4693) was enacted. It is titled the **Global Malnutrition Prevention and Treatment Act of 2021, and it** sets out programs and otherwise directs the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) to carry out activities to prevent and treat malnutrition globally.


February is Black History Month. To celebrate what would have been his 123rd birthday, here are a few quotes from Langston Hughes, poet and activist.



Do not remove from packaging.) / One pack of flushable wipes (Unscented. 42 count) / Six laundry detergent sheets (place sheets in small Ziploc bag)

Place all items in the plastic bag, remove air, and seal. / All items must be new.

Do not enclose personal notes, money, or extra items in the kits.
