<u>Presbyterian Women Synod of the Northeast (PWSNE) 2023</u> TRIENNIAL GATHERING



Grace and peace I bring to you in the name of Jesus Christ!

Well, the much anticipated dates of July 14, 2023 and July 15, 2023 have come and gone. And not without obstacles. Mother Nature created much flooding, ruination of roads, homes, etc., and created roadblocks and detours for the women of our Presbyteries attempting to travel to Stony Point, New York for the Gathering.

However, these roadblocks did not deter the women who did attend, including our amazing keynote speaker, the Rev. Dr. SanDawna Gaulman Ashley of the Synod of the Northeast, to deliver an inspiring message, how women are doing the 'first' of everything. Let's continue this trend.



Kuki Meitei

There is currently another case of genocide which has barely been reported in the US, in the far northeastern state of Manipur, India. The villagers in the mountainous areas are predominantly Christian members of the Zou tribe of the Kuki people. As a minority group, they have been previously protected by the Indian government. In the valleys, most people are members of an ethnic group called the Meitei, who are primarily Hindu. Even though they are in the majority, they are demanding to share in the benefits and expand into land reserved for the minority. Since early May, violence has resulted in the deaths of approximately 200 tribal members, over 200 churches burned, and 65,000 tribals in refugee camps, plus others displaced staying with family. Rather than attempting to restore peace, government troops and police have aided the Meitei. The national government has done little to stop the violence. A video of the assault of two naked Kuki women and the murders of their brother and father by a mob of 800 men shown on Indian TV was considered too horrific to be shown on US television.

Among the victims of the violence is Rev. Mangmuanthang; one of his churches was burned, he can't get to the second, and he and his wife and two children barely escaped when their home was burned. Currently they are living at the Mount. The village of Singngat has been fortified, and a militia has been formed. Pictures are available on the PWSNE Facebook page.

(PWHRP's involvement in Manipur and the development of the Gary Prayer Mount dates to early 2016. We were joined by PW in the Synod of the Northeast, who contributed offering money from the 2017 triennial gathering to construct a set of modern toilets, in an area where open defecation was the dangerous norm.)

Prayers for peace are crucial, and eventually better plans and funding will be needed.

2023 Triennial Overview

It was a hot Friday morning on July 14th when the Design Team began arriving to set up the meeting room for our 2023Triennial Gathering. After a quick lunch, members of the Coordinating Team arrived for their 1 PM meeting (CT minutes were sent to CT members). By 3 PM, 50 women and 1 man had managed to find their way through all the detours to Stony Point Center, NY. Our keynote speaker called to say she was on the way but detained due to the detours from the flooding. So... as good Presbyterian Women do, we improvised.

Our Chaplain, The Rev. Kathi Jones, officially opened the Gathering with prayer. Our Seminarian, Rebeka Fergusson-Lutz, with Ardelle Stewart back in a familiar spot to us – at the piano – led us in singing some familiar hymns. The Rev. Kathy Reeves, Churchwide Moderator, spoke to us about PW training and how PW is recovering after the Covid pandemic and working to stay connected. She asked for donations to the Thank and the Birthday Offerings. PW is celebrating its 35th year anniversary and donations of \$35 for 35 were requested.

The Rev. SanDawna Gaulman Ashley, Transitional Leader for the Synod of the Northeast, arrived and was well-worth waiting for with her dynamic message about IOU. She told us that women do what is necessary, expected, and needed, and then they do more.

After dinner, Moderator Adebisi Shofu commissioned Marianne Montero, our PW Synod Rep. on the upcoming USA Mission Experience journey to the Southwest US.

Women of the Bible, a skit featuring many women at the Gathering who were recruited by Virginia Champlin, and costumed with imagination, followed. Former PWSNE Moderator Charlotte Hasselbarth narrated. The Rev. Kathi Jones closed the day's gathering with prayer. An Ice Cream Social followed.

Saturday, we opened with music and singing led by Rebeka and Ardelle, followed by the opening prayer led by The Rev. Kathi. JoAnn Estella gave us an overview of the upcoming *Horizons* Bible Study: Sacred Encounters. Magdalene Lewis presented information on the UN Commission on the Status of Women. The Business Meeting followed (Minutes were sent to the CT and to PWP Moderators/Voting Reps). Highlights were the approval of a new structure for the CT and election of leaders.

Lillian Sanderlin presented ideas for Mission Projects. The Rev. Jyungin Lee, Past Moderator of Churchwide PW, told us about "Korea Peace" and asked for support to help end the war In Korea (an armistice was declared 70 years ago, but a peace treaty never was signed).

Lunch came next, then the closing Worship, Communion, and Installation Service led by The Rev. Kathy Reeves and assisted by The Rev. Kathi Jones. Virginia Champlin was installed as the new Moderator, and outgoing Moderator Adebisi Shofu presented her with the Moderator's stole and gavel. In turn, Bisi was honored with a Presbyterian Women Honorary Life Membership pin and certificate.

Moderator Virginia Champlin charged us with closing remarks and The Rev. Kathi Jones gave the benediction.

Now, when you look at the PW logo of the three women – think of IOU – Inward: Bible Study, Outward: Mission, Upward: Worship and Prayer.

Why does it have a beacon?

Who thought it was a good idea to build and maintain?

It is amazing how far we have come. Often travel is by road, or even by air. Few people discuss traveling great distances by boat. When going on vacation, even less people discuss a cruise. Yet at one time that was the primary method of travel for great distances. The many ships that have crossed the oceans in the need of trade, or even the immigration that occurred to our country in the 1700s and 1800s was accomplished in this manner.

So, the lighthouse enables safe travel to shores that were rocky, to get past outposts in a storm where the ship steward just can see in the storm or the moonlit night. The beacon of light that would be shone from the lighthouse would be an almost welcome sign that travel was over and rest would soon begin.

PWSNE have long adopted the lighthouse as an emblem of purpose. We offer women a space to discuss growth, to feel welcome, to take a break, to learn skills before re-engaging in the church at large. Our Lighthouse Newsletter offers a glimpse of what is happening around the Synod of the Northeast as well as being a space of artistic freedom where our editor and publisher attempts to fit our thoughts and experiences in an interesting and flowing pattern.

As for the best news, we have a new pin. A new lighthouse pin, which can be yours for \$5.00, plus shipping. It has a grainy texture on the face of the pin and now has a double clasp making it more secure.

Mysteries to Solve—Any Clues???

Two mysteries have us stumped! The first is the banner pictured. It shows a white



star with colored rays streaming from it. Placed on a blue background, it is approximately 3 feet wide by 7 feet long. Who made it? When was it made? Why was it made? This banner was discovered in the Historian's Box and displayed at our Triennial in July. No one attending had any idea of its story. No explanation was included with or on the banner. If you remember anything about the making of this banner, please contact the PWSNE Historian, Joanne Schnaudt, at iwschnaudt@comcast.net

The second mystery goes back about 30-35 years. Identical chalices and plates were made for a Churchwide Gathering, possibly one at Iowa State, for every PWP and Synod PW in the US. After using them for the Communion service, the Moderator of each PWP and Synod PW took one set home with the directions they were to be kept at their respective Presbytery or Synod's office. We haven't seen them since. Are they still at the Presbytery and Synod offices or have they been discarded? They were off white pottery with the new PW logo on them. It is believed that a small piece of the Berlin Wall was molded into each chalice. It would be meaningful to find them and use them at our Gatherings as we celebrate the 35th Birthday of Presbyterian Women this year. If anyone can trace what happened to their presbytery's chalice and plate (especially the 7 NJ presbyteries now merged into 4), please contact PWSNE Historian, Joanne Schnaudt, at jwschnaudt@comcast.net

2023 Horizon's Bible Study Workshop

Presbyterian Women Synod of the Northeast held a bible study workshop, using the new "Sacred Encounters" PW Bible Study. It was a two overnight time together where us "faithful oldies" joined with some new women to share how they had a sacred encounter with Jesus. We missed meeting in person and it was great to be able to and to see familiar women (and one retired pastor, loving husband and gallant chauffeur) face to face. There were some first time women there also! We met at the PCUSA conference center at Stony Point.

Rev Linda Gaden was invited to lead the workshop. Linda is a long time Presbyterian Woman and second career pastor. She was invited to save the transportation fees we'd have to pay to have the author (who usually is invited) fly in from Georgia to New York. What we got was a fabulous knowledgeable engaging leader with a great sense of humor and aurora of compassion and concern. We plan to get the DVD from the PW store to hear the author and her perspective on those encounters. If only we were more tech savvy (or had our own easier to use PC or iPads with us) we could have watched the introduction from the author on the PW you-tube video.

I remember meeting Linda at a Newton (now Highlands NJ) PWP meeting (now Gathering) where she did an announcement dressed as a news boy waving an Horizons Magazine high over her head saying (ok I'm paraphrasing - who can remember exactly that long ago?) "get your red hot news". She went on to become PW Presbytery moderator, she moved to the role of a Commissioned Lay Pastor (now CRE) and then was called to ministry and attended seminary. As much as some things change the essence stays the same! Doesn't PW help create leaders? During the presentation she told a story of how she "met Jesus" at a food kitchen one Thanksgiving. She volunteered to serve and one latecomer invited her to sit with him. Long story short when he left without his "goodie bag" she ran out to give it to him he was nowhere to be found. She looked everywhere. Her conclusion was she spent Thanksgiving dining with Jesus.

She brought a retreat like flavor there with prayers (prayer board to post intercessions), morning worship, evening vespers and a final communion service. There was time for silent reflection, fellowship, strolling the grounds, nap taking, and of course food and snacks. Did I mention wine and sparking cider?

I loved this study! I'm thinking my "little group of faithful" women at my home church who attend a monthly study, will love it too. This workshop gave me a few extra helps to put in my leadership "bag of tricks" to bring back to them. The scriptures that were chosen by the author as examples of encounters were perfect and easily related to. They also relate to how Presbyterian Women are called to not only share sacred encounters with each other but with the world. The study highlighted "the others", for example those marginalized by handicaps in one chapter. We discussed action items about dealing with handicapped people. We not only talked but had opportunities to do some crafts for those of us who learn by doing. Bookmarks, prayer bead chains, stained glass like hangings were fun!

This was one of the times it was wonderful to get away from the every day routine and take some time for ourselves and enhance our relationship with and knowledge of God. Presbyterian Women are like that, making opportunities for prayer and bible study, figuring out how they can support the mission of PW and each other, looking for practical ways to participate in church missions, truly seeking justice and peace and having times like this one as opportunities for true community building.




