Spirit-Filled Fellowship at the 2025 Annual Gathering and Business Meeting

Presbyterian Women in the Synod of the Northeast

The 2025 Annual Gathering and Business Meeting of the Presbyterian Women in the Synod of the Northeast was a beautiful two-day event filled with spirit, fellowship, and worship at Hamilton Union Presbytery Church in Guilderland, NY. Held both in person and via Zoom, the theme, "Refreshment for the Journey – Come Get Recharged," truly came to life as women from across the synod came together in faith and community.

We were deeply moved by two heartfelt presentations from recipients of the Thank Offering, both from the Albany Presbytery. Mary Anne Davis, Vice Moderator of the Presbytery of Albany and Rev. Donna Elia, Executive Director of Troy Area United Ministries and Pastor at St. Peter's These inspiring women shared their powerful stories of how PW support is making a difference in their ministries and communities.

Day one ended with fun and games during dinner, offering time to relax, laugh, and bond. We returned the next morning for meaningful worship and practical workshops designed to equip and support PW groups. The two workshops"How to Set an Agenda" and "How to Take Minutes"-were well received and offered valuable tools for effective leadership and organization.

During the business portion of the meeting, we covered important updates, shared reports, and looked ahead to the future of our work. Lunch was a time of joyful fellowship and connection with one another.

We celebrated the installation of our new officers, followed by closing worship that sent us out with renewed purpose and gratitude. Warm conversations and heartfelt hugs marked our departures, sealing a weekend of encouragement and connection.

A special thanks goes to the women of Albany Presbytery and Hamilton Union Presbyterian Church, whose hospitality made the gathering even more joyful and welcoming.

Truly, this was a weekend to remember—full of spiritual refreshment, sisterhood, and hope for the journey ahead.

Thank Offering

Presbyterian Women's Thank Offering was initiated in 1888 and has been supporting organizations with grants to support mission for many years. Each year domestic and international projects are selected to help meet critical needs. Forty percent of the offering is used to support hospitals and community health programs. The remaining sixty percent is put toward new creative ideas for mission.

This year St. Peter's Presbyterian Church in Spencertown, NY, Albany Presbytery, received a Thank Offering grant of \$50,000 to put toward a complete renovation of their kitchen. St. Peter's is a significant gathering place for the community, including people of diverse backgrounds, races and socio-economic circumstances. The church has a long history of welcoming and advocating for the LGBTQ+ community, for refugees, and other oppressed people. Several years ago, St. Peter's started Soul Café, a pay what you can or not at all meal

which gathers a wide array of people in a way that fundraising dinners do not. Building upon its history of hospitality to bring the wider community together, St. Peter's will increase its presence as a community center with the renovated kitchen. Cooking classes and learning to make healthy meals with local produce are part of their outreach plan.

Another \$50,000 grant was given to the Hope Housing Collaborative of Lewis County. Olympia Presbytery, for building tiny home duplexes in Centralia, Washington. Homestead Presbytery received \$5000 to provide beds for children in need in Omaha Nebraska,

Another seven grants ranging from \$6,000 to \$45,800 and totaling \$132,897 were awarded from the money collected in 2024. Everyone is encouraged to support the Thank Offering and the work that they do to better the lives of others.

Financial News

Twenty years ago, Presbyterian Women in the Presbytery of Albany (PWA) had sixteen active groups that contributed to our operating fund. That number gradually diminished to two plus a few donations from generous individuals. In 2010 we instituted a \$5.00 registration fee for our Spring and Fall Gatherings to maintain a financial fund to cover our expenses. This fee was increased to \$10 this year due to the lack of donations. We use our income to support the operating budget of Presbyterian Women in the Synod of the Northeast (PWSNE) and give a small honorarium to each of our speakers. We

also cover some of the expenses for our moderator to attend the PWSNE and churchwide gatherings, and support the representatives on USA Mission Experience trips. Two women were recently given scholarship money to help meet the expense of attending the Horizon's Bible Study workshop at Stony Point Center. All money collected from the free will offerings at the Spring and Fall Gatherings is given to mission projects of the speaker's choice. It would be appreciated if each PW group in the Presbytery of Albany would make a small contribution to help cover our expenses. Horizon's Bible Study Workshop Experience Thank you to PW in the Presbytery of Albany

I deeply appreciate the \$200 scholarship toward the cost of attending the 2025-2026 Horizons Bible Study Workshop, on "Finding Resilience, Joy, and Our Identity in Jesus Christ" at Stony Point Center from June 19-21. It was held in The Gilmor Sloane House, a charming mid-1800's style country home on the Stony Point Campus.

About twenty women attended. Some were new to me and some were people I had known for many years from other PWSNE activities. Our Moderator Elder Andrea Ralph and I rode there together, which made the experience even nicer.

It was led by a team of two clergy women: Rev. Joyce Mackichen Walker and Rev. Sarah Henkle. They led activities that promoted discussion on a few of the lessons in the study. I learned that there are many ways of looking at the

various Biblical characters and stories. Our conversations provided a lot of food for thought.

I expected to come home with handouts and guides to help in leading the Bible study in my PW group. There were no handouts. However, I left with a strong connection to this Bible study. The program provided interesting information, activities and discussion. I felt connected to the Biblical characters we talked about. The leaders provided historical information on familiar Bible stories and characters plus led very stimulating discussions. They encouraged personal sharing. I came away with a deeper sense of how the experiences of various Biblical characters may have affected their lives. I'm looking forward to the time when my PW starts this Bible Study. I will have a long wait, as my PW is a year behind.

The contributions from the individual PW groups in our Presbytery and registration fees from our Gatherings provided the income that allowed for me to receive such a generous scholarship.
