## News from Haddon Heights, NJ

### Women's "Friendship Circle" News

#### **KIVA LOANS**

Since 2012, the Women's Friendship Circle of First Presbyterian Church Haddon Heights has provided \$14,875 in Kiva loans to women in underserved communities throughout the world. These women are entrepreneurs who need a little help to expand or improve their businesses. The loan is usually \$200. Although that appears to be a small amount, its impact can dramatically improve the recipient's business and life. Each recipient is expected to pay back the loan over time. In 13 years of providing Kiva loans, 98% of our recipients have paid back their loans in full. The Circle currently has four outstanding loans.

#### **SUPPORTING THE MUDGIRLS**

At the October 18 fall gathering of Presbyterian Women in Haddonfield, several members of the Friendship Circle enjoyed a presentation about MudGirls Studio, a non-profit organization located in Atlantic City. MudGirls Studio provides opportunities in art and entrepreneurship to economically disadvantaged and at-risk women by providing training in the creation of unique and beautiful ceramic pieces.

Members of the Circle voted to support MudGirls Studio in two ways: (1) Individual members opted to order ceramic pieces for their own use and as gifts, and (2) the group made a monetary donation to the organization in November. Additionally, our women's group encouraged interested members of the congregation to add to our group's monetary donation or order their own lovely ceramic pieces.

## The Women of Grace Widows Fund is still going strong!

Since 2008, we have been sharing God's love with a group of widows in northern Malawi, Africa through the Women of Grace Widows Fund. Our aim is to increase the health and security of the widow and her family by providing:

\*Housing improvements that are beyond the means of the widows

\*Assistance with unexpected critical needs (hospital transport for medical care, fertilizer during a poor growing season, repair of storm damaged housing)

\*Sewing training for a reliable opportunity to boost household income

The widows have learned to sew washable menstrual kits and are paid for every finished kit, providing a reliable income. Approximately 700 kits are distributed for free each year to local school girls to help them stay in school.

We will return to Malawi in May 2026 for 3 weeks to continue to listen to the widows, look at recent joys and challenges, and determine the next steps. Please pray for safe travels and God's continued blessing on this wonderful project.

### **Meet A Widow.....Coliness Tembo**

Coliness was born in Mzimba district in 1957. She started school in 1962 in Grade 1 but dropped out after Grade 6 due to lack of money for school fees. She married her husband, Lyson Nyangulu, at age 18. She says "I met my husband when he came by our village. He was desperately looking for a wife to marry and spotted me. He asked my parents to marry me and I agreed." Lyson worked in forestry at the Lusangazi Forest in Nkhata Bay district but died in 2006 after an operation for a tumor.



Coliness and Lyson had 2 daughters and 2 sons, all of whom have died. She was left bearing all the burdens of raising her grandchildren. In 2016, Coliness' inadequate house crumbled in the rainy season. "I would sleep out in the open with my grandchildren. We had no choice but to face the harsh seasons. I felt my life was meaningless. When Women of Grace Widows saw my situation, they built a house for me." "Every time our sewing products are sold, I am able to pay school fees for my grandchildren and able to afford some basic needs such as food, soap, and salt. Together we are able to help girls manage their menstrual hygiene which encourages them to go to school."

“To me, the widows’ group is a place of turning people’s lives around. I am grateful for the tremendous help I receive from our supporters in America and I pray they will continue. God should bless our supporters, keep them from any attack from Satan, and keep their families safe and blessed”

## Did You Hear the Bell Ring?



Many of us have watched the 1946 Christmas movie "It's a Wonderful Life."

Remember the bell rings when an angel earns their wings. The bell rang for a very special Presbyterian Woman when Barbara Epley Shuck, brook the bonds of this world and joined the angel choir on Jan. 31.

Barbara was a learner, educator, journalist, photographer, newsletter editor, den leader, Sunday school teacher, bookclubber, and adventurer. She fought for justice, love and kindness and most assuredly walked humbly with her God. She shared her many talents with the YWCA, where she had a part in establishing services for domestic abuse and rape crisis. She was a vp and board member of League of Women Voters and Pres. of the American Association of University Women. In her local church she started their Community Thanksgiving Dinners, Food Pantry and other community services. She was Moderator of Presbyterian Women in her church and Presbytery, and the Moderator of Synod of the Northeast 1999-2001. She was a participant in the Global Exchange to the Middle East and traveled throughout the Synod sharing her experiences. She became a Commissioned Lay Pastor in 1990 and did substitute work in churches for 30 years. She shared her skills as President of NY Church Women United and served on their national board representing the Northeast.

The ringing bell symbolizes the lesson that 'no person is a failure who has friends' and

Barbara will best be remembered as friend to all who knew her. Barbara leaves three sons, eight grandchildren two great grandchildren and a sister.

A Memorial Service will be held March 21 at First Presbyterian Church, 1 Elm Street. Whitesboro, NY at 11 am with reception following. Whitesboro is near Utica and not far from the NYS Thruway.

Memorial donations would be appreciated for the Whitesboro Church, Abraham House which offers free end of life care, the Utica YWCA and the Heifer Project.

From Virginia——Notes from the January meeting of Moderators across Churchwide.

Susan Jackson Dowd will coordinate an Action without Meeting in February for the voting representatives to the 2027 Business Meeting and will send a blurb to the synod mods to advertise this upcoming action.

This is to aim to address voting representatives for the Churchwide Business Meeting. She proposed amending the quorum requirement in the national bylaws to a simple majority, reflecting changes in church demographics. Susan assured participants that a formal recommendation would be sent out, allowing for email participation

# JOIN THE PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN OF THE GENEVA PRESBYTERY FOR ITS SPRING GATHERING

*She arrived alone and afraid. The two-day bus trip gave her ample time to relive the trauma of the daily abuse. It also gave her time to imagine her future. She was ready for change, prepared to find hope and to heal. We watched her spend her last dollar at McDonald's, and then we drove her to the Potter's Hands Foundation safe home. Here, she learned she was loved. She learned that she had value. She learned that she had her own bed, she made friends who believed in her. She ate and reflected and grew - as a free woman with an independent mind and dreams.*

*Twelve months later, a newly confident young woman drove herself to her graduation party where she was greeted by dozens of friends and mentors. During her time with Potter's Hands, she earned her high school equivalency diploma, a driver's license, nursing assistant certification and full-time employment. Equally important, she embarked on a healing journey from trauma, addiction and abuse, and she found the conviction to lead other survivors of trafficking toward healing, wholeness and independence.*



We will also assist these individuals in building a support network of healthy relationships with family, friends, and community. Their overall goal is to support these women through the restoration process enabling them to become healthy and productive members of their communities.
